A ceremony for the successful graduation of Bachelor's and Master's degree students in the specialties of the Faculty of Public Health was held on April 5 at Magnum Auditorium at the Second Clinical Base Prof. Dr. M. Ganchev at the Medical University -Pleven. Master's and Bachelor's degrees were awarded to 124 graduates of the faculty - 21 Master's in Public Health and Health Management specialty; 40 Master's and 25 Bachelor's in the Health Care Management specialty; 24 Bachelor's in the specialty Medical *Rehabilitation and Ergotherapy* as well as 14 Bachelors of Public Health Conservation and Control.

Extract from the speech of Prof. Florian Steger, Director of the Institute of History, Philosophy and Ethics of Medicine, Ulm University, Germany

'Today, medicine is a professional field to which, in addition to patients and physicians, many of the highly qualified and diverse health care providers contribute with their knowledge, skills and abilities. This applies to you who have studied at this famous university. It has prepared you thoroughly to

become rehabilitators, health inspectors, nurses and midwives who are preparing for their role as health managers. You have learned a great deal and are now qualified to work not only in your home country, but also outside its boundaries, in Europe. Because Europe is the focal point of our common history, it represents the common values we share... In short, all those who care for patients are part of medicine and healthcare. In antiquity, this work was carried out without much tension between the various professional groups and in creative, patient-oriented interaction - and thus remarkably harmonious. In my opinion, this should be a motivation for all of us. After all, people are the biggest health resource. At the heart of our work are the patients for whom all of us, healthcare professionals, care. We must always be aware that we are working together to provide the best care for the patient. Because, above all, first-class medicine means not only high-

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level technology, but also people who care for others, for those who want or need our help, whether this care is ultimately achieved through prevention, through curative or palliative care... The human factor affects us all. It should not only, but above all, be a major resource in the health sector. Let us all note that we need to be mindful of one another when caring for patients! Let us respect others' point of view, support others when they are weaker, and together fulfill the most important task - providing the best care for the patient in a healthcare system characterized by a diversity of different specialists!

PROF. DR. GRIGOR GORCHEV WAS BESTOWED WITH THE ORDRE DES PALMES ACADЙMIQUES (THE ORDER OF ACADEMIC PALMS), OFFICER, 2ND CLASS BY THE FRENCH REPUBLIC

On April 5, 2019, the Ceremony for the awarding of Bachelor's and Master's degrees in the specialties of the Faculty of Public Health was preceded by an emblematic event, held for the first time in the history of the Medical University - Pleven - the Bestowment of the Order of Academic Palms to Prof. Dr. Grigor Gorchev, MD, PhD. The prestigious award was presented by His Excellency, Mr. Eric Lebedel, Ambassador of the Republic of France to Bulgaria. "Today, we welcome and acknowledge a worthy scientific career, remarkable for the will to develop gynecological medicine in Bulgaria, the Balkans, on the basis of strong and long-lasting cooperation with France," the French ambassador stressed. The order is bestowed for excellence in education and for contributing to the international integration of the university by a joint decree of 14 July 2018 by the Prime Minister, based on the proposal of the Minister of Education of France.

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The Order of Academic Palms was created on March 17, 1808 by decree of Emperor Napoleon Bonaparte, and was later introduced in its present form by a decree on October 4, 1955. The distinction was created for university professors, and today it is accessible to all people working in the field of



education. It is the oldest modern French award and the highest possible honor for education figures. The violet color of the Order symbolizes the harmony between blue and red, a sign of wisdom, knowledge, tolerance and authority. The Order acknowledges and rewards the work done for the cause of education and training.



THE FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH HOSTED THE SIXTH EDITION OF THE DAY OF BIOETHICS

The Day of Bioethics this year was held under the motto "Clinical Ethics". The forum was opened by Prof. Yankulovska, who after a short presentation of the history of Bioethics Day and the current official guests - Prof. Florian Steger and Dr. Marcin Orzesovski - welcomed Assoc. Prof. Dr. Galya Stavreva, Vice-Rector of Research, who addressed the attendees. On behalf of the Rector of MU - Pleven, Prof. Dr. Slavcho Tomov, Assoc. Prof. Stavreva emphasized the uniqueness of the scientific event on a national and international scale and the satisfaction of the hosts with the quality of lectures and presentations of the participants over the years. Certificates were given to the two official guests and Prof. Steger was given the floor.

Prof. Steger's lectures presented in a logical sequence the practice of clinical ethical counseling in Germany, the requirements for ethical consultants and

the existing training programs at the Academy of Ethics of Medicine at the Professional Medical Association. His second presentation focused on prenatal diagnosis: methods and benefits, the assumption of the burden created by the birth of a disabled child and the objections to it, the argument of eugenics and the stigmatization of disabled people. The topic provoked intense discussion and was followed with particular interest by midwifery students.

The Day of Bioethics was concluded by a poster session with materials prepared by Bulgarianlanguage and English-speaking students majoring in medicine. The case studies presented were prepared on the basis of the 4-step principle method and were highly praised by Prof. Steger and Prof. Yankulovska, who moderated the session.


MU – PLEVEN REMAINS A VITAL PART OF THE SCIENTIFIC MAP OF BULGARIA

With the assistance of RAC (Regional Academic Center) -Pleven, on February 28, 2019, in the Assembly Hall of the Municipality of Pleven, a Ceremony was held on the signing of the Memorandum of Cooperation between the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences (BAS), represented by the President of the BAS, Academician Julian Revalski, and the Mayor of the Municipality of

Pleven, Georg Spartanski. The agreement is the second in the joint history of the two institutions and will last for 5 years. It reflects the region's specific interests and needs and intends to deepen cooperation between BAS institutes and local authorities, cultural and educational institutions, businesses, as well as facilitate applications for joint projects.

Later the same day, at the Telecommunication Center of the Medical University - Pleven, Academician Dimitar Dimitrov opened the exhibition "Women in the History of the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences" organized by the Scientific Archives of BAS, RAC - Pleven and the Medical University - Pleven. The documentary exhibition is a retrospective view of the topic of women and the place they occupy in the creation, development and establishment of the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences and all its academic units.

On March 1, 2019, the University of Medicine - Pleven hosted the Day of Biomedicine, which was held under the auspices of the President of the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences, Academician Julian Revalski and the Mayor of the Municipality of Pleven, Georg Spartanski. The Scientific



Forum is organized by the Regional Academic Center (RAC) - Pleven with the support of BAS and in close cooperation with the National Academic Network. The scientific session was held at the Ambroaz Pare Hall of the Telecommunication Center.

The Day of Biomedicine was also one of the ways to mark and celebrate the 45th anniversary since

the establishment of Medical University - Pleven. For the last 45 years, the University has made many remarkable achievements - from just a Regional Faculty of Medicine, belonging to the structure of the Medical Academy - Sofia, it has become a leading medical center as well as a focal point in the world of robotic surgery. Lecturers at the conference were world-class scientists, academicians from the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences, BAS members and professors: Academician Damyan Damyanov, Chairman of the Assembly of Academics and BAS Members, Academician Alexander Alexandrov, Academician Atanas Atanasov, Academician Dimitrov, Corr. Prof. Dr. Grigor Gorchev, MD, Director of the Research Institute at MU -Pleven, Prof. Dr. Slavcho Tomov, MD, Rector of the University, Prof. Din Garabed Minasyan - IKI, BAS. Official guests of the event were Academician Bogdan Petrunov, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of MU - Pleven and Nikolay Chernozemski, Chairman of the International Research Foundation "Hasumi - Bulgaria".





On April 12, 2019, at the Magnum Hall of the Second Clinical Base for yet another year, the Faculty of Medicine organized a solemn graduation ceremony for the international doctors from Class 2019. The event was attended by the relatives of the graduates, professors and students of the university. In charge of the ceremony was Prof. Angelina Stoyanova, Head of the Center for International Students, while the Academic leadership was represented by the Rector of MU - Pleven, Prof. Dr. Slavcho Tomov, Vice-Rector for Academic Affairs, Prof. Margarita Alexandrova and the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, Prof. Asparuh Asparuhov.

After successfully completing a 6-year training course in Medicine, entirely in English, 64 international students from the 2013-2019 Graduate Class in Medicine have acquired a Master's degree and a Doctor's degree. The young international graduates are nationals of 12 countries - Turkey, Greece, Germany, Nigeria, Sweden, Serbia, France, Pakistan, Spain, Kazakhstan, Denmark and the United Kingdom. With the highest success score of an Excellent (5.94), Dr. Azhar Khan from the UK became the 2019 class valedictorian.

This year, Medical University of Pleven maintained the tendency for a high admission of international students, aiming to study "Medicine" in Pleven. On February 18, 2019, the academic year 2018/2019 starts for the newly admitted 250 international students from 28 countries, most of them European. For a second consecutive year, the highest number of students come from Italy (120), followed by citizens of the United Kingdom (34), India (20), Sweden (7), Canada (6) and Japan (9). For the first time, students from the Republic of Cape Verde have enrolled at the university.

From February 24 to February 27, 2019, the Dean of the Faculty of Public Health, Prof. Dr. Sylvia Alexandrova-Yankulovska participated in the International Conference on Robotics in Rome. The Scientific Forum was organized by the Pontifical Academy of Life. Before the forum began, His Holiness, Pope Francis gave an audience in which the Head of the Roman Catholic Church received and congratulated the participants in the conference. Prof. Yankulovska met the Pope as the only representative from Bulgaria. She participated in a joint development project with the Rector of Medical University - Pleven, Prof. Dr. Slavcho Tomov on the topic "Ethics of Robotic Surgery in Bulgaria". The forum provided an opportunity to present the project for the construction of the Center for Competence in Personalized Medicine, 3D and Telemedicine, Robotic and Minimally Invasive Surgery, Leonardo da Vinci. The personal discussion with Professor Barbara Bass of the Huston Methodist Institute for Technology, Innovation and



Education, as well as the participation of Prof. Yankulovska in all the discussions in the three main parts of the conference, contributed to the accumulation of significant scientific material in the field of robotics.

Professor Stark's name is also associated with the introduction of the gold standard for Caesar's section.

Leading specialists in the field of obstetrics, gynecology and fetal morphology as Corr. Prof. G. Gorchev, Prof. Dr. S. Tomov, Prof. A. Shterev, Prof. Petya Chaveeva, Assoc. Prof Stratieva, Prof. Timeva and others were also speakers at the forum. During the event a scientific session was held with a presentation of students. With the participation of one of the most famous experts in the world in the field of autoimmunity, Professor Yehuda Schoinfeld, the Eighth International Workshop was held in Pleven. A RARE LIFE-SAVING CARDIOLOGIC OPERATION WAS SUCCESSFULLY PERFORMED AT UMHAT **'HEART AND BRAIN' - PLEVEN**

Cardiac surgeons from Pleven saved a patient who had a rare combined blood vessel rupture. Prof. Dr. Vladimir Danov, cardiac surgeon, Medical Director and Head of the Cardiac Surgery Clinic, University Hospital "Heart and Brain" and Assoc. Prof. Nikolay Dimitrov, invasive cardiologist, performed a minimally invasive procedure by implanting a stent. The so-called "hard-team" is always at the hospital, taking around the clock shifts. It was exactly this specialized team that took over and initiated a timely intervention with a stent graft. The subsequent 8-hour long, successful life-saving operation resulted in the successful implanting of a biocative prosthesis.



"Upon performing a control tomography, it appeared that there was a second rupture in the area of $\Box\Box$ the main artery leading to the brain. A secondary surgical intervention would have been extremely difficult to perform," stressed Prof. Vladimir Danov. According to the surgeons who performed the rare operation, such a case is extremely rare in the medical practice.



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
